When this project was started in 1959 I still had visions of getting a 100% response from the members of FAPA, something which to my knowledge has not been achieved since the first glimmerings of time, and I should have known better.

In my simple-minded way I am quite convinced that the balance of the membership will fill out the forms attached to this issue (two each: one to return, one to keep) and that previous contributors will look up their names in the following pages and make corrections where necessary so that it will be possible to publish a completely up-to-date version of the WHO ZOO in FAPA's 100th mailing.

The most incomplete items in this present version, to my way of thinking, are these: the date and mailing number with which each member joined the organization; your principal FAPAZine titles; the estimated total number of pages you have contributed to FAPA during your membership; and the number of times you were among the top ten in the egoboo polls prior to 1949. I had also been stymied by the offices held by various members until Ron Ellik came through with his listing of the FAPA officialdom since 1937, for which I am duly grateful.
