The following people have expressed an interest in exchanging tape recorded correspondence. The topics usually start out on science fiction, but quickly range to everything from politics to music to religion. I would suggest an exchange of letters before sending a tape. This will insure that your tape recorders are compatible, there is no use sending a four track tape to a person whose taper is two track. The C after the address means the person has a cassette tape recorder, the S that he has a reel-to-reel tape recorder which will take 3 inch reels at 3 3/4 ips. By the way. Please do not send me tape recorded correspondence, unless you are willing to wait a year or so for the reply. I normally do something else while I listen to tapes, and so don't pick up enough of what the speaker is saying to ~~reconstruct~~ make a decent tape in reply, and I ~~hate~~ hate to spend the time taping a reply which I could be using for typing two or three letters. I just prefer to receive my letters in the form that I can read and keep (I do ~~not~~ keep all my correspondence).
