I have one and it is in excellent condition, and even includes a short Tom Mix Mystery (including the solution). He also publishes HeroHobby Magazine, mainly concerned with old radio shows, but also includes items on Movies, Cartoons, Broadcasting, Magic, etc, \$4/4 issues.

Mr Don Livingston, 8555 Southlands Cres, Chlliwack, BC, ~~Canada~~ Canada Here are the Bradbury tapes you wanted, plus the hour SF panel disscussion from the CBC. Portions of the beginnings of two of the Bradbury tapes are missing thanks to the tapes jamming. I was using 'bargain' tapes-no more-the Hitachi tapes seem to be very good however and I've had no trouble with them so far. There's about 10 min missing from 'the happiness machine' and five or so from 'Mr Jones'. The Helen Loomis segment s complete but there is some annoying spill-over from adjacent AM stations at spots. I have four BBC Sherlock Holmes programs on tape, they were recorded in 1966 on reel-to-reel tape. The stories are: Priory School, Silver Blaze, Stolen Three Quarter, Adventure of the Retired Colorman. If anyone is interested in them, let me know. A new BBC tv series is showing here--Doomwatch. Its very good and often has plots of an sf nature. The first program, the one on the rats, xx was most effective with an uncompromising ending--the grisly death of the heroine scientist. She was attacked and eaten by the rats. Strong stuff for tv. The plots of this series are excellen-intelligent, witty and believable and the casts are uniformly good. I am going to try to tape one of the more interesting programs and will send it on to you x later, if you are interested.
