In TNFF -Dec '71 on page 16 in the news items there is a mention m that TDK might be putting out 3hr and 4 hr cassettes. I don't know

about the recording quality of the longer cassettes, but there are a few problems. This information a came from the electronics shop in Hannible. All cassette tapes have to be the same size. By this, it was explained to me, that all cassette cases are a standard size with the reels the same size and placement so that they can be used in any cassette recorder. Because of this the only way they can make a longer cassette is by making the tape in them thinner.

Say a C60 has tape 1/16" thick. A C240 would be 1/24"--about 1/4 as thick (I don't know that this is the exact amount, but it would have to be thinner so it could fit in the case)

Because of the thinner to pe you wanter can have problems. If anything interfers with the power supply-weak batteries, a reduction in the electricity— the tape may catch on the capstan and wrap around them or is can be fed into the insides of the tape recorder. The result (if you are lucky) is is maybe a wrinkled tape or broken tape and (if you aren't lucky you have to have someone clean the tape from the inside of the recorder.

The C240 tapes would be nice, but we night Tim find we have some "hungry" recorders on our hands.

I don't know if the guy was right or not, but I've found my recorder 'eating' the Cl20 tapes much easier and quicker than the C60 tapes.

And now James E Miller, POBox 459, Manhattan, Kansas, 66502 writes: TAPE CASSETTE RECORDING

During the past two years, I do not know about the rest of you, but I have found that I have come to break a lot of cassettes on fast rewind and fast forward. I came to one solution, and to those of you who have cassettes and have this problem, may find it helpful.

When your tape cassette breaks, if it breaks at the end, splice it together and run it to to tape, that is, if you want to add additional tape. This splicing can be done in a normal way, and wound on a reel type recorder. I have done this on C60 and have put additional tape to make it a C120 tape.

When you are finished, before you come to the end of the tape you are splicing, leave part of the tape on there, wo so if you want to, you can add onto the reel that you have w unwoulnd from another reel. Sound complicated? Tis. for me, the first times I did it, the tape wrinkled up in the cassette, but after that, when I spliced and added or of the way through the broken cassette tape, I found that it was OK.

For you cassette owners who have enountered this problem, give it a try, and let me haer from you, if I can advice you better, I wi= will do my best, US and internation likewise.
