This page is always the last to be stenciled. This time I'd like to begin by reviewing The Hog on Ice, which was crowded off page 12.

I recently got hold of Catch 22 and have read as far as the chapter that introduces the catch. I'm wondering, Is that all there is to it? Catch 22 has become a catch phrase--a FAPA or two used it in the last mailing--as if it were a logical paradox to match "No generalization is absolute, not even this one." Actually it seems to be of about the logical quality of the resolution of Fearless Fosdick's split personality episode. " Aside from that, in his interview Heller seemed sensible and had something to say.

Depends perhaps on what you mean by a "classic textbook". If you're still hung up on pioneer works, that's one thing. But if you're looking for the best introductions to subjects, you might look at Lancelot Hogben's trio and some of Gamow's popular books.

I believe a word or phrase used in writing, like "bummed out", should be more generally understandable than an allusion like "W J Daugherty in Steffens' need be. After all, I was citing a fanish instance of "bare with me"--if you forgot that, the delay was yours, not mine--and the main requirement of a citation is that it be uplookable. " It is Vietnam-era dialectics to rest on a position one has reached by some obscure process, and state merely one's affective reaction of disagreement, with no interest in seeing whether the apparent difference of opinion can be bridged or understood. If the idea that my generation has done well in solving its problems were only a Juffusian idiosyncrasy, an exclamation point in brackets might suffice as comment, but the same thought has been expressed by the great cham, Harry Warner, and columnists like Joseph Kraft.

I'd like to hear the argument that FTL travel is possible. I don't want to believe it impossible, but thought the matter was pretty well settled.

This Synapse is stenciled on a Selectric, and the results show some problems. The inhibition that tells the typewriter not to strike characters such as " with full force is sometimes overdone. Worse, the cord that pulls the golfball to the right broke on me recently. Dick Patten replaced it. It broke again a few lines above. "I'll bet you do someday tell the "too sad a story to ever tell" about NorEasCon and the "end of my mundane life".

Issue 12 of the above title immediately follows it in the bundle, so on to that: Unless one is very interested, an acronym like "TEFL" in a review of some other book doesn't immediately call to mind the title referred to. "Gleaning these stories together in one volume" is a misuse of the word "Gleaning". And for that matter, "being a faneditor and not a normal book reviewer, I'm going to attack this from a proportionately different angle" is a misuse of "proportionately". "I appreciate your book reviews. They identify books that I would like to read as a result of your reviews.

DEVILS WORK (Metcalf)

What you mean "mundane apa such as FAPA"?

Of course abbreviations should suggest the title of a magazine, but it should be possible to invent two-letter abbreviations that would suffice, especially in an index, which'll be accompanied by a key. Az is obvious for Amazing; Astanalog presents a problem if one is to keep the same abbreviation despite mutations of name, as I desire, but not an insuperable problem. "In what sense was the Clayton Astounding the first literal pulp in sf?" "I'm not familiar with the short story version of Ship of Ishtar. Did it originally end where the doves of Ishtar wedded them?" "Did Harold Lamb write for Adventure?" "Blair's 1984"?

SOME STUFF FOR FAPA (Bangsund)

From 4¢ postage to 20¢ is a 400% rise, not 500%. "I don't understand expected top temperature for Hobart in January of 19, even if that's centigrade. That would be more like the average of day and night according to Climate & Man." Turner says Waverley "is a worthy ancestor, but dear God! what it has spawned! (Prince Valiant? I ask you!)" Assuming this incoherent manner of speaking is intended to malign Prince Valiant, I suggest he should have sought an example on which there is consensus that it is bad. "Perhaps what was really heretical about the question of what would have happened if Lenin had not been delivered at the strategic moment in Russia is its implication that accident, rather than historical necessity, could have affected the great revolution." Chandler planted at the beginning of his final anecdote the information that he was in a nudist camp, as neatly as Willis touching up a second draft. "Metcalf's word "pseudo-fandom" raises the hackles as much as "pseudo-science" for science-fiction. Fandom, whatever it is, is genuine. If it were trying to be something it is not, if it were for example trying to be what Metcalf thinks it should be, then it might deserve such a disparaging word." Alderson seems to say the purpose of the New Testament is merely "to save men and deliver them from the fear of hell or death or punishment." Since he is not willing to affirm anything about the afterlife, "to save men" and "deliver them from the fear of ... death" do not add anything to "deliver them from the fear of hell ... or punishment". So what does Christianity do for people that can't be accomplished more simply by not believing in an afterlife? "Chauvin: "isn't that the important thing in a piece of fiction - emotion?" Not necessarily. "I suppose the kind of comment that pleases me most is one which takes a principle I've discovered

and mentioned, and applies it to something i hadn't thought about. '' At the end of Rose Hogue's letter, i have a marginote that it's hard to tell when your editorial comments begin. Maybe i should have dropped you a post-card to that effect, because my next marginote suggests that instead of taking several lines in ØG for private remarks ending with "I promise I will write to you Real Soon Now", you should have written your remarks to her alone and saved stencil, paper, postage, and the reading time of your thousands of readers. '' "to be tentatively titled 'Private Worlds'" is not a split infinitive as you say, but is an absurd phrase, something like "the alleged slayer". '' The phrase "Official Bloody Editor" establishes what i'd already suspected, that "bloody" is an infix. Nothing else could divide the words "Official" and "Editor", which have a stronger bond than "to" plus infinitive.

What strikes me about the black keys alone is that--according to what i've heard--all bugle calls can be played on them alone. '' Connecting alcoholic cultures with material achievements and hashish with lack thereof appears to embody the fallacy post hoc ergo propter hoc. On a stencil prepared at an Aq SFS session which seems unlikely ever to be published, i set about doing that. Vast difference. '' Spanish windlass? Doesn't he mean Chinese windlass? '' The type face used for Starboard Watch is a great relief from microelite. I know you can get more on stencil with the latter, but i pay for it with eyestrain and wondering whether a given word is "comer" or "corner". and another is "Turner" or "Tumer". '' What's steam radio? '' Hurray for Farmer's "unimitatable". I hate "inimitable". '' You should always publish letters verbatim. I don't mean in extenso. '' I don't remember that any authority has declared that "To be a fan, quite apart from any other qualification, you must claim or admit that you are a fan."

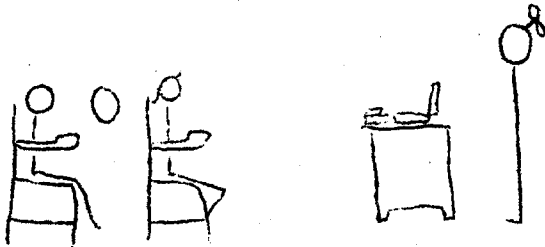
MYOB may be an instance of an apa that didn't make a mailing because no one sent in anything to distribute.

PHILISTINE QUARTERLY (Markstein)

The advocates of Basic English have of course heard that objection, and have answers to it. So far as i have read, i think this is part of the answer. There is no definite division between phrases whose meaning is predictable from the constituents, like 'come in', and metaphorical meanings, like 'Come on!', just as no dividing lines appear between literal and transferred meanings of nouns, as in leg of a horse, leg of a table, and leg of a journey. When teaching foreigners, one should begin with the central meaning, and later bring in the meanings that are transferred, and those that for practical purposes are merely arbitrary. But i believe the main thrust of my quotations concerned persons to whom English is native, it is healthy for us, too, to employ these useful little words in preference to Latin-derived substitutes. Your use of "give up" / "surrender" as an example prompts the question: what is 'surrender' but Basic French for the same thing in English? If you'd give us a little margin in which to work up our notes, we might produce more polished comments. Now, with jelly, jam, marmalade, and preserves, the situation is about the same as it would be if we had no generic word for handguns or pistols, but had always, when we wanted to mention one, to specify whether it is a revolver, automatic, derringer, or whatever. The similar lack of any convenient general term for municipal corporations forces us into the clumsy phrase "city, town, or village" whenever we want to talk about the category, or some member of it without deciding which is the best label. As for your examples, in practice we do use the same word for butter and margarine (butter, though the advertisers say "spread"), but never have occasion to subsume mayonnaise under the same term. With green and red you are almost, but not quite, being ridiculous. A writer on language has pointed out that some races who demonstrably can distinguish as many hues as Indo-Europeans nevertheless have for general purposes only a twofold division of the spectrum, and that this is actually more useful than our system for some purposes, such as classifying flowers by color.

I recently got an offer of the OED compact edition, and am debating whether to take it. I'd love to have the OED, but am not sure what kind of prices i'd be letting myself in for by joining the book club that offers it at such a bargain.

I wonder whether you really are "aware of all the terrible things that would happen if there were no government to protect me from" criminals. I suspect that you are somewhat like the Enlightenment philosophers who imagined man in a state of nature as behaving just as he did after seventeen centuries of sometimes Christian civilization, without them. An account i have heard of how things went in the Baltimore police strike is not reassuring, and i can chalk up another reason for being glad i don't live in the Big Apple this fall.

"It would be up to the VP to rule--therefore, one would expect him to be the one to whom resignations are tendered." Nay, that follows not; and therefore your whole line of reasoning hung on it drops off.
