Vonda McIntyre Bio-Bibliography by Jon D. Swartz, Ph.D. N3F Historian

Vonda Neel McIntyre was born August 28, 1948, in Louisville, Kentucky. She was educated at the University of Washington, Seattle: B. S. in biology (with honors), 1970; graduate work in genetics, 1970 – 1971.

Personal Life

One of the earliest successful graduates of the Clarion Science Fiction (SF) Writer's Workshop (1970), McIntyre was an explicit feminist SF and fantasy writer who, before becoming a full-time writer, was a riding instructor, keypunch operator, and writing instructor.

She has also been a conference coordinator/ organizer (including a Clarion SF Writing Workshop), served as writer in residence at Clarion West (in 1984 and 1990), been a visiting novelist at Humboldt State University, worked for a SumThff Page




mer Arts program at California State University, spent a fellowship year (1994) at a screen writing workshop in Hollywood, and had given readings and talks at numerous places on a variety of subjects including genetic engineering, the women's movement, and the claims of psychics.

Publications

First SF publication: "Breaking Point" in Venture (February, 1970); First novel: The Exile Waiting (Doubleday, 1975); First collection: Fireflood and Other Stories (Houghton Mifflin, 1979).

McIntyre's award-winning "Of Mist, and Grass, and Sand" was expanded in 1978 into her award-winning Dreamsnake, the story of a healer named Snake on a quest for an alien creature that will assist her in helping the ill and dying. McIntyre also edited (with Susan Janice Anderson) a collection, Aurora: Beyond Equality (1976), an anthology of feminist SF stories, not all by women.

In addition, McIntyre authored several movie novelizations and "Star Trek" novels (1981-- 1986); published a young adult novel, Barbary (1986); and wrote The Crystal Star (1994), a "Star Wars"



book.

Her "Starfarers" series, with another female protagonist (a black physicist from Earth), resulted in four additional titles: Starfarers (1989), Transition (1990), Metaphase (1992), and Nautilus (1994).

The anthology Nebula Awards Showcase 2004 was edited by McIntyre.


Her The Moon and the Sun (1997) introduced her fans to a sea monster in the court of Louis XIV.

Awards/Honors/Recognitions

Nebula (Novelette) for "Of Mist, and Grass, and Sand" in 1973; Nebula (Novel) for Dreamsnake, 1978; Hugo (Novel) for Dreamsnake, 1979; Nebula (Novel) for The Moon and the Sun, 1997.

She was only the second woman to win the Nebula award and the third to win the Hugo award for best novel.

She was an author GoH at the 73rd World Science Fiction Convention, also known as Sasquan, held August, 19-23, 2015 at the Spokane Convention



Center, Spokane, Washington.

Concluding Remarks

Interviews with McIntyre have appeared in several publications, including Starship/Algol (Spring, 1979), Galileo (November, 1979), SF Chronicle (May, 1993), and Locus (February, 1998).

She received her first rejection slip at age 14, for a Fantastic Four comic book script she submitted to Marvel

Vonda famously made beaded and crochet Sea Creatures, including jellyfish, anemones, and marine flatworms.

Death

She died on April 1, 2019, at her home in Seattle, Washington, of metastatic pancreatic cancer, which

had been diagnosed in February.

We are offering Travelers again in case the above reviews have piqued your interest.

Travelers - 3 seasons - Members and RM needed. New series - Black Mirror Needs at least one other member to start. This series has a RM and 1 other member.

We have two NSRR waiting for RM and members Stranger Things - 4 seasons - Netflix says the 5th and final season will be coming.

Raising Dion - Raising Dion - 2 seasons -on-going

Please contact me if you are interested in joining and/or becoming a RM.

If you have a suggestion for a NSRR please contact me.

- 1 A member chooses the series he/she wishes to watch.
- 2 When they have decided which series they wish to watch they contact me and I will tell them whether there are enough members to begin the RR
- 3- When there are 2 members, and the Robin Master, the RR will begin.
- 4 The Robin Master (RM) emails the Netflix Streaming Round Robin (NSRR) members with a schedule. Two episodes a week are recommended when starting the RR. However, more episodes a

week can be considered if the members choose to do so. ALL members must agree to the number of episodes watched in a week. We want this to be a fun adventure. Not a cumbersome one.

2024 N3F Amateur Short Story Contest

Story Contest Rules and Entry Blank

- 1. This contest is open to all amateur writers in the field, regardless of whether they're members of the National Fantasy Fan Federation. For the purposes of this contest, we define an amateur as someone who has sold no more than two (2) stories to professional science fiction or fantasy publications.
- 2. Stories entered in the contest must be original, unpublished, not longer than 8,500 words in length—and must be related to the science fiction, fantasy, or similar genres in the opinion of the judge.
- 3. Email attachments of Word documents are acceptable for submission. Manuscripts on paper should be typed, single sided on 8 1/2"-by- 11" white paper, double spaced, with pages numbered. The name of the author should not appear anywhere on the manuscript to ensure impartial judging. Photocopies are acceptable, if they are of good quality. Computer printouts must be legible.
- 4. Contestants can enter up to three stories. Enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope (SASE) if you would like your story returned at the end of the contest. Stories will not be returned without an SASE. Do not send your only copy in case of accidental loss. We are not responsible for lost manuscripts.
- 5. Email entries will be accepted. Send to Jefferson P. Swycaffer at abontides@gmail.com. No guarantee can be made of email receipt. Privacy and property rights will be absolutely respected. No one other than the Short Story Judge will ever see the submission. Before the contest is decided.
- 6. There are no entry fees.
- 7. Cash prizes totaling \$100 will be awarded as follows: First prize is \$50, second \$30, and third \$20. Honorable mentions and semi-finalists will receive a certificate of award.
- 8. Send all manuscripts to the contest manager: Jefferson Swycaffer, P. O. Box 15373, San Diego, CA 92175-5373; abontides@ gmail.com. Emails with the story attached in word format are preferred. Paper manuscripts are acceptable. All entries must be received or postmarked no later than Dec. 31, 2024.
- 9. The Short Story Judge is a published science fiction professional, and also a loving fan of the sf and fantasy genres. All comments and critiques are solely the Short Story Judge's opinion, but he promises to be constructive and polite.
- 10. Stories will also be reviewed by the Editor of the N3F Fiction zine Eldritch Science; authors of suitable tales will be invited to submit their tales for publication in our zine. This review and invitation will only occur after contest winners have been announced, so it can have no effect on the contest outcome.
- 11. The NSF may want to publish an electronic book including top entries from one or more years of publication. You will not be contacted about this until after the contest is over and prizes have been awarded. If we want to publish your story, you will have to sign over to us first world serial rights. Your willingness to sign over rights cannot affect whether or not you win the contest. Winners will be notified as soon as the judging is completed. Announcements and notifications of winning entries will be made by March 2024. Please take your time and submit your best work. You can resubmit stories previously entered if they did not win previously. All entries will be kept confidential and will be judged fairly and anonymously. The deadline for all entries is Dec. 31, 2024. Good luck!
