Compare the repro on THE nos. 5 and 6. The typing pressure is not really satisfactory for cutting stencils with a golfball machine without a plate. It is not nearly as critical for manual typewriters. However you do get cleaner repro there too. Correction - you can cut a cleaner, sharper stencil.

Moffati: I don't care what you say. Even if "pomegranate" is correct it isn't right. No word should be spelled that way.

Vixen: Last summer Marsha, Eliot Shorter, and Sandy Parker took me to Coney Island which has some of the biggest roller coasters in the world. On one of them we got to see a couple of real roller coaster freaks in action. They were sitting in the front seat of the front car. As the car got to the top of the launch they lifted their arms in the air in the v sign and were waving their arms in the air and screaming in ecstacy for the rest of the ride.
